Basic touch-point cleaning checklist

√	Telephone equipment including headsets where used	✓ Door handles and releases

√	Mouse	✓ Infotainment / radio	
>	Chair arms and controls	✓ Control stalks

√	PDQ machines must be cleaned before use and again before returning it to the base unit by the colleague using it for each transaction.	✓ Keys

Cleaning Product Information

Please ensure the correct products are used on surfaces. If in doubt, please consult with your line manager

➤ Bleach-based products should <u>NOT</u> be used on any exterior or interior vehicle surface



Leather / PU / PVC / TPO

- ✓ Use mild, neutral soap solutions
- ✓ Wipes and cloths used must be soft and non-abrasive
- **DO NOT** use any solution containing alcohol

Fabric cleaner

- ✓ Dilute the solutions with fabric cleaner in
- ✓ Fragranced fabric cleaners may be used
- **DO NOT** clean local spots as may get staining at edges but clean whole area.

Fabrics - other

- ✓ Use interior shampoo
- **DO NOT** clean local spots as may get staining at edges but clean whole area.

Plastics / Chrome plated parts / Veneers (not open pore) / Painted Plastics

- ✓ Use mild soap solutions
- ✓ Use alcohol solutions and wipes
- ✓ Use weak peroxide cleaners
